# A guide to understanding YOUR PRIVACY RIGHTS

Californians' privacy rights were officially established with the passage of the California Consumer Privacy Act (CCPA) in 2018. What are your rights? A simple way to remember them is LOCKED:

Limit

**Limit** a business's use and disclosure of your sensitive personal information to only certain purposes allowed under the law.

Opt

**Opt-out** 

**Opt-out** of a business's sale and sharing (for cross-context behavioral advertising) of your personal information.

### Correct

**Correct** inaccurate information a business has about you.

#### Know

**Know** the information the business has collected about you and why they collected, disclosed, sold, or shared it.

#### Equal

**Equal** treatment by businesses: you can't be discriminated against for exercising your CCPA rights.

**Delete Delete** personal information businesses and their service providers or contractors have collected from you.
