Tips to Protect Your Privacy

Click the link



Websites are required to allow you to select your privacy choices by providing a link in their privacy policy and usually at the bottom of their website.

Toggle the toggle



Sometimes websites offer privacy choices through a pop-up banner. Instead of hitting "accept" you can use the toggle to opt-out.

Use Privacy Tools



Tools like Global Privacy Control (globalprivacycontrol.org) can automatically signal your privacy preferences to every website you visit without having to manually toggle the toggle or click the link.
