California Update

- CalPrivacy sponsored bill
- CalPrivacy supported and watched bill update

FEDERAL UPDATE

- **HR 8413, SECURE Data Act**

- CalPrivacy submitted an opposition letter and also joined a multistate opposition letter from a coalition of 18 state attorneys general and privacy authorities
- Ongoing engagement opposing preemption (3 trips to DC; advocacy meetings)
- Subcommittee hearing on the bill held in early June; Bill still in subcommittee

- **HR 7757, Kids Internet and Digital Safety Act (KIDS Act)**

- Includes Kids Online Safety Act (KOSA), COPPA 2.0, data broker registry for data brokers that collect and sell kids' data, among other things
- Explicitly allows states to provide greater protections
- Passed the House

- **Senate Kids and AI Markup**

- Markup of bills on kids and AI expected late July in Senate Commerce Committee
- Could include pieces of House KIDS Act, Senate KOSA, Chatbot bills, AI preemption language

MULTISTATE UPDATE

- **Comprehensive privacy bills**
 - 4 new comprehensive privacy laws enacted (AL, LA, OK, VT)
 - Several bills still pending (e.g., MA, PA)
- **Privacy law amendments**
 - Prohibitions on the sale of sensitive data, geolocation data, and children's data (CT, NH, NJ, VA)
- **Delete Act style bills**
 - CT enacted Delete Act-style law
 - VT enacted data broker registration bill requiring study of deletion mechanism
 - NJ enacted data broker registration bill that prohibits the sale of sensitive data by data brokers
 - NY Delete Act-style bill still pending
- **ADMT bills**
 - CO enacted revised ADMT law focused on transparency

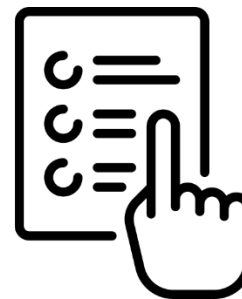

CalPrivacy Sponsored Bill – SB 923 (Becker)

Expanding Privacy Rights Act – amends CCPA



Expand the right to delete to allow deletion of all personal information, no matter the source



Require online businesses to offer multiple methods to submit privacy requests, such as webform

Bill	Update
AB 1542 (Ward) Sensitive personal information [SUPPORT]	With Senate Appropriations.
AB 322 (Ward) Precise geolocation data [SUPPORT]	2025 bill that amends the CCPA to provide increased protections for geolocation data. Currently in Senate Appr.
AB 883 (Lowenthal) Data brokers: Accessible deletion mechanism: elected officials & judges [SUPPORT]	Amended to require the Secretary of State & Judicial Counsel to notify elected officials and judges about DROP; requires data brokers to process deletion requests in 30 days. CalPrivacy has support position on the amended bill. With Senate Appropriations.

(AB 302 (Bauer-Kahan) & SB 1106 (Cabaldon) amended in full on 6/11/26 and no longer implicate the Agency)

Kids Bills

Bill	Update
AB 1159 (Addis) Student personal information	With Senate Appropriations.
AB 1709 (Lowenthal et al) Covered platforms: age restrictions: e-Safety Advisory Commission	Prohibits kids under 16 from creating an account on a covered platform, and incorporates e-Safety Advisory Commission from AB 1700. With Senate Appropriations.
AB 1856 (Wicks) Age verification signals: Software applications	Extends age verification signals law to app stores and developers. With Senate Appropriations.
AB 2007 (Bauer-Kahan) Youth programs: identifying information of youth	With Senate Appropriations.
AB 2246 (Wicks) Online service, product, or feature: access by children	Modified version of Age Appropriate Design Code. With Senate Appropriations.
SB 1119 (Padilla)/AB 2023 (Wicks/Bauer-Kahan) Companion chatbots: child safety	Companion bills regulating children's use of chatbots. Each bill is in Appropriations in the other chamber.

Bill	Update
AB 311 (McKinnor) Consumer Driving Data Protection Act	Amended in full in June to allow opt-in use of telematics for insurance rate setting. With Senate Appropriations
AB 1018 (Bauer-Kahan) ADS	2025 bill regulating the development and deployment of ADS. On Senate floor.
AB 1883 (Bryan) Workplace surveillance tools	With Senate Appropriations.
AB 1979 (Bonta) Health care services: AI	Bill regulates the use of chatbots for health care services. With Senate Appropriations.
AB 2561 (Valencia) Operating systems & applications: privacy settings	Eligible for vote on Senate floor.
AB 2564 (Ward) Surveillance pricing	Eligible for vote on Senate floor.

Senate Privacy Bills

Bill	Update
SB 354 (Limon) Insurance Information and Privacy Protection Act	Revises the Insurance Information & Privacy Protection Act to provide comprehensive privacy regulations for insurance licensees and their 3rd party service providers. With Assembly Appropriations.
SB 690 (Caballero) Crimes: invasion of privacy	Introduced in 2025. Recent amendments remove the private right of action for pen register and trap and trace claims related to conduct occurring on websites and apps. With Assembly Appropriations.
SB 947 (McNerney) Employment: ADS	Regulates the use of ADS in employment context for, among other things, disciplinary, termination, or deactivation decisions. With Assembly Appropriations.
SB 1130 (Reyes) Crimes: invasion of privacy: wearable devices	Regulates the design, use, and operation of wearable recording devices. With Assembly Appropriations.

State Agency Bills

Several pending bills establish new administrative requirements for state agencies covering various topics, including:

- Rulemaking process - NDAs
- Antihate speech training
- Telework program evaluation
- Public communications
- Public records access (PRA)



Bill for Board Consideration

Bills that directly affect the Agency

Amend the CCPA

Amend the Delete Act

Directs Agency to Act

Staff recommends taking a formal position on the following bill:

SB 435 (Wahab)

CCPA: personal information: exemptions

Amends the CCPA to narrow the definition of publicly available information that is exempt from the definition of personal information

- Removes the following category from the definition of publicly available:
 - “Information made available by a person to whom the consumer disclosed the information if the consumer has not restricted the information to a specific audience”
- Modifies a second category as follows:
 - Information that ~~a business has a reasonable basis to believe~~ is lawfully made available to the general public by the consumer or from widely distributed media.

Staff recommends a support position on this bill
